This year was different.

2020 brought new challenges for the dedicated volunteers of reTURN the Favor. Due to quarantine requirements for the Covid-19 pandemic, this year's season started two weeks late, group size was limited, travel distance was restricted, and only experienced volunteers were able to participate. But that didn't slow down the rescue, with record breaking rescues this year.

Since 2013, hundreds of volunteers, with the support of reTURN the Favor partners, have rescued stranded crabs in New Jersey, saving the lives of over 500,000 crabs and inspiring their friends and family to also take action.
